

Thank you for joining us!

Welcome to our fourth annual NYC Shorts event, Shorts of All Sorts! We are honored to be a part of the Directed by Women global celebration created by Barbara Ann O'Leary.

Eric Rice and I first met Barbara online because of our shared passion for film - and specifically films helmed by women. My study of female filmmakers began when I was getting my M.A. at the CUNY Graduate Center and in my film studies endeavors delved into the stories of the incredible women of Early Hollywood. There I also started working on a feature documentary project The 2nd Sex & the 7th Art: Women Directors in Film where I scoured social media platforms to learn more. At the same time Eric was working on a campaign #shecandowhatyoucando wherein he watched a film a day by a female filmmaker and tweeted out about it afterward. We both individually came across Barbara's initiative and with the help of Custom Made Theatre Company's Leah Abrams we decided to organize our first evening of short films "directed by women" in 2015 screening at Ryan's Daughter on the Upper East Side in NYC. Four years later we have moved the event to Videology and continue to curate an evening of celebration. We are enthralled by all the talent out there - that of those filmmakers you will see tonight as well as the many filmmakers who submitted to us from throughout the world who didn't make it into the evening - because we couldn't do a four-hour screening!

Eric and I have been making progress on the documentary (for more information, check out our website:

The2ndSexandthe7thArt.com). So much has happened in the past eight years with regard to the attention and opportunities for women working in film – and yet more work still needs to be done. "In 2017-18, U.S. festivals screened almost three times as many narrative features directed by men as by women." (Martha Lauzen, Ph.D San Diego State Center for the Study of Women in Television & Film, Indie Women: Behind the-Scenes Employment of Women in Independent Film, 2017-18.) From the shorts we have watched I know that it is not due to lack of talent so I hope the focus on opportunities for female filmmakers continues! In the meantime we'll keep watching.

This film explores how Dia de los Muertos, the Mexican tradition of families and friends gathering to remember their departed loved ones, is celebrated in Los Angeles. Set amid the Dia de los Muertos Festival at Hollywood Forever Cemetery, this film tells the story of a mother-daughter team whose Ofrenda (altar), asked all of us to contemplate the question: What is a bad death, a good death and a great death?


